

## Mentoring participant guidelines

Considerations for each participant in a mentoring program – the organiser, the mentor and the mentee.

Mentoring participant guidelines broadly describe the differing roles of the mentor and mentee. Prompts help guide each participant's response to a range of issues. For a mentoring relationship to be successful, each participant needs to have a clear understanding of what they are hoping to achieve from the process and how they want to get there. These ambitions need to be clearly discussed and made transparent to the other participant.
